Project update

Piambong Wind Farm is considered a State Significant Development (SSD) and will be assessed by the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI).

Vestas must complete an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), which is a series of detailed studies on potential visual, noise, biodiversity, traffic, cultural heritage, and other environmental and social impacts associated with the Project. These studies ensure any potential impacts can be carefully considered and addressed.



To date, we have completed the following surveys:



Biodiversity

- **Eight** site visits
- Approx. **680** field hours
- Evaluating flora and fauna, including vegetation communities, birds, bats, and migratory species

Our Project is being planned to reduce biodiversity impacts by strategically placing infrastructure and roads.



Noise

Our Project is being designed to ensure noise levels at all non-involved residential properties remain below the DPHI established limits.



Visual

The Project is located about 20km south west of Gulgong and 20km north west of Mudgee, outside of the townships.

We are designing the Project to minimise visual impact. We have commenced advanced visual impact assessments, and will consider findings from these studies in the ongoing design process of the Project.



Cultural Heritage

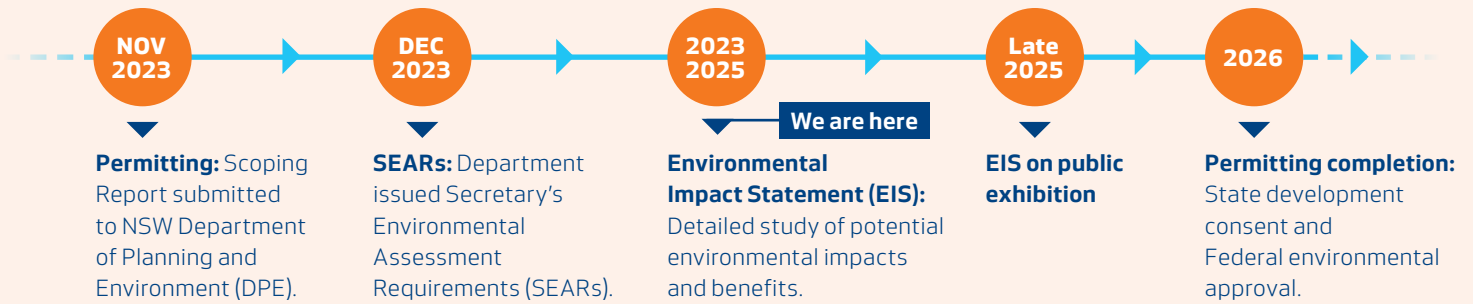
We will be conducting cultural heritage surveys in collaboration with local Aboriginal groups in the first half of 2025.

We are committed to protecting cultural heritage and will maintain ongoing consultations with Aboriginal stakeholders throughout the Project's development and design phases.

Survey findings will be made available in the EIS.
