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Project update



Investment Delivery Authority

The NSW Government has endorsed the Piambong Wind Farm as a priority project under the Investment Delivery Authority (IDA), which supports major projects by improving whole-of-government coordination and helping proponents navigate planning and regulatory processes.

This endorsement recognises Piambong Wind Farm's alignment with government priorities, its demonstrated merit, and its importance to Australia's energy transition. The NSW Treasurer has recently noted that renewable energy investment is helping NSW avoid a recession in 2026, reinforcing the broader economic importance of renewable energy projects such as Piambong. Renewable energy is not just desirable, it is required to meet legislated and strategic policy outcomes, with Piambong well positioned to contribute through local employment, regional investment and clean energy generation.

You may notice our contractors undertaking investigations to inform this work. These investigations may include property boundary surveys, geotechnical investigations, engineering surveys, and biodiversity surveys.

Our technical studies are progressing well. We are currently reviewing the data to inform our evolving design.

Local spend

Since the early stages of investigation, the Project has supported the local economy. We have spent more than \$400,000 locally on accommodation, equipment and resources, and on local professional services ranging from printing to legal services.

We have also purchased around 400 trees from Watershed Landcare in Mudgee, which were sourced from seeds in the area. The collection includes a diverse range of native species.

Supporting the local community is important to us, including working with local suppliers wherever possible.
